Should Women Be Required to Register for the Draft?

This is a matter that seems to be brought up every year in defense bills and it seems to gain support each year as well. Congress is currently looking at expanding the draft to women. Why is there a constant drive to include women in the draft? Below are some answers that are commonly given in support of this:

- Including women in the draft will further equality.
- If women are voting for the next Commander in Chief, foreign policy, laws, etc., then they must take responsibility for their votes, enforce them with arms, and be subject to the draft like the men are.
- It is not fair for the women to vote and send the men to war while they are exempt from it. They need to share the responsibilities for their vote.

The origin of this debate goes all the way back to the woman suffrage movement in the United States. The push for expanding the draft to women is one of the results of the woman suffrage movement. There were Christian women who opposed the woman suffrage movement for many reasons and one of those reasons was because it meant the possibility of women being subject to the draft. Mrs. Helen Johnson, who lived during that time, wrote, "To be a voting citizen, is to be a possible soldier citizen. There is no way of fulfilling the moral part of the duty, and leaving unfulfilled the physical, and it is cowardly to attempt it ... The Suffragists demand equal vote in sending their fathers, brothers, sons, husbands, and lovers to the military field of action, and propose to be absolutely exempt from an equal share in the duty that that vote now lays upon male voters." Mrs.
Johnson went on to write that even the suffragists admitted that "women could not claim the vote while it was necessary to defend opinions



by arms." The suffragists believed that society had advanced enough that the use of arms would no longer be necessary and therefore women could vote without having to enforce their vote with arms. However, a quick glance at history proves their optimistic assertion to be false. World War I, II, Korea, Vietnam, etc. prove that the use of arms is always necessary to maintain peace and enforce laws. Not only that, but violent riots and protests within our own nation require the enforcement of the law by means of arms. The need for arms continues which is another reason for the push to include women into the draft today. The US is struggling with recruiting right now and is very concerned about war with China in the near future. Our leaders are often saying that it is not a question of if we go to war with China, but it is a question of when we go to war with China.

God's Word, however, opposes sending women to war and we Christians must follow God's Word on the matter. This responsibility is laid on men who are the leaders of their families. St Paul writes in Ephesians 5, Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her ... In the same way husbands should love their wives ... God expects men to lead their families and with this headship comes the responsibility of laying down their lives. God

calls wives to submit to their husbands as the Church submits to Christ, but He doesn't call the women to lay down their lives for their husbands. God calls the men to lead and sacrifice. This also reflects the relationship between Christ and His Church. The Church did not die for Christ, but Christ died for us and we follow Him. Christians must oppose expanding the draft to women. It is evil and cowardly for a nation to send its women to die. That is the men's responsibility. Women may serve in many supportive roles in the military (such as medical, law, tech, etc.), but God's Word opposes sending women into

combat. We see this in ancient Israel's history as well. God sent the men to war and not the women. Joshua 4, The men of the tribes of Reuben and Gad and of half the tribe of Manasseh, ready for battle, crossed ahead of the rest of the people, as Moses had told them to do. In the presence of the Lord about forty thousand men ready for war crossed over to the plain near Jericho. May we be faithful to God's Word, follow it alone, and be salt and light in this fallen world.

WORD FROM THE CENTER

³⁷And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. ³⁸But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace!

Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. ⁴⁰He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" ⁴¹And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" (Mark 4:37-41)

REAL PEACE AMIDST THE STORM!

God's peace to you amidst whatever "storm" you are facing today.

I think that's an appropriate greeting for Christians because of the many issues we are encountering in our lives. There are the typical troubles of health and well-being that all of us face, that's for sure. But there is also an especially vitriolic feeling in America toward anyone or anything that asserts God's moral limitations to our libertine attitudes of absolute freedom. We know how to protest, but we don't seem to know how to be virtuous anymore, right? And the attacks on those who even remotely hint at such moral truths are getting more and more noxious by the day. That's why this event in the life of Jesus and His disciples is one of my favorites. Here He is, Godin-the-flesh, an empathetic, merciful Savior for ALL. Yet He was willing to enter this sinful world so that He can save us eternally. He literally took upon Himself the eternal ramifications of our sin, our death, and the righteousness judgment that we deserved. So if you are looking for a Savior who can help in your time of need and who can calm the fears of His disciples, then and now, well, that's right up His alley.

There are so many things in this passage today that can bless us. First, the extent to which God in Christ is willing to go to save us is amazing. He leaves the power of the heavens to be born in a manger. He is willing to be vulnerable to a world that is in rebellion against its Creator. He is willing to serve to the point of exhaustion and to sacrifice, enduring even the painful humiliation of the cross. Why? Because He loves us with a magnificent love. Yet, we, like the disciples often cry out, "Jesus, Don't you care?" When He stopped the storm that day, they got a glimpse of

the power that He would unleash through His suffering, death, and resurrection for them and for all. You and I can grasp that reality as we read the Scriptures every day.

Remember daily that Jesus wants you to trust Him, especially in the middle of the storms you face. He doesn't dismiss or disregard your fears. Yes, He may help you escape or overcome them. But if you must endure the storms of life, He's the One who can always see you through. He can even make such trials turn into an ultimate blessing to you and for others. Above all, He promises that nothing in this life will separate you from Him, from His love, and from His life and salvation (see Romans 8:35-39).

These last few years have been terrifying in many ways. Today there are many saying, "Look to me, put your faith in me, vote for me, and I'll get you through this." No, Christ is our peace amidst the storms of life, and we will put our faith in Him ALONE. In a world often hell bent on libertine, amoral living, vote to keep the government and its leaders in their proper place (see Romans 13:1-7). Then let us be, even more, people of Christ who are obedient to His Word and gracious to our neighbors on His terms alone. He's the source of real peace and blessing, even amidst the storms. After all, wind and waves are ultimately no bother to the one who is the Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer of the world.

PRAYER: Dear Lord Jesus, I don't always know why you allow difficult things to happen in my life. But when they do, strengthen my faith to trust in Your purposes for my life in ways that also seek to bless others. AMEN.

The 63rd Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) South Dakota District was held June 7 and 8, 2024 at the Ramkota Convention Center, Aberdeen, SD. 240 attendees from across the state met under the theme "Inexpressible Joy † Matchless Savior" based on the Bible verse *Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy with that is inexpressible and filled with glory, obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls (1 Peter 1:8–9). Local attendees were Alice Johnson, Diana Kieffer, and Nancy Bogenhagen.*

Kay Kreklau, 17th president (2011–2015) of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, was the Keynote Speaker. Greetings from LWML were given by Arlene Naasz, LWML Vice President of Organizational Resources. Katy Gifford, past LWML Nebraska South District President, from Wheaton, MN, shared information on LWML's Gifts of Love. Bible studies were led by author Donna Snow, LWML Texas District.

Convention Offerings: 2024–2026 Mission Grant Goal — \$4,332.89 and Mission Central — \$3,299.00. In addition, the Mission Walk raised \$1,080.31, Mite Bites raised \$77.03, and the Pastoral Counselors Mite Challenge raised \$3,537.77.

Those attending the convention participated in the following Servant Events: 151 diapers made out of T-Shirts and/or flannel material for the Orphan Grain Train, many Christian bookmarks and cards for Phil's Friends for cancer patients; 300 witness bracelets for M.O.S.T. (Mission Opportunities Short Term), and 200 mitten puppets for The Puppet Place at the South Dakota State Fair.

Gifts from the Heart: A multitude of gifts were brought for Journey Home and Safe Harbor, both of Aberdeen, SD.
